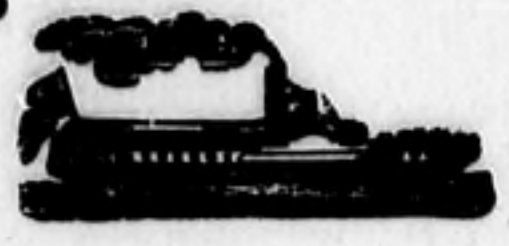

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John Vail of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Moses Fuller of Seneca Creek N.Y. being

SOLE OWNERS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the Barcelona whereof Chancy bail is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Denville in the year 1836 as appears by the Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo N.Y. Sept 1st 1843 now surrendered having changed Owners No 38

And The said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Deck and Gr. Mast and that her length is Ninety four feet and nine inches her breadth Fourteen feet and four inches her depth Five feet and ten inches and that she measures Eighty nine tons Twenty four ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no gallies and a Scroll head.

And the said John Vail of Buffalo having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this Third day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five.
