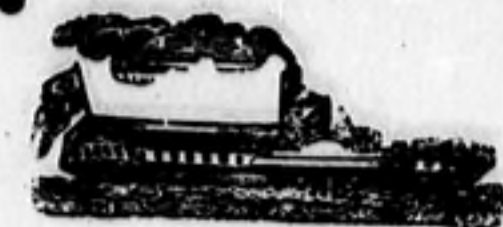


ENROLLMENT.



DISTRICT OF BUFFALO CREEK,

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

James M. Sundry Atty for *David Fish* of *Silver Creek New York* having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that the said *David Fish* together with *Chauncy Sampson* of *Silver Creek N.Y.*

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Comodon Chauncy*, whereof *David Fish* is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Silver Creek New York* in the year 1843 as appears by Her Enrollment dated at this Port the twenty eighth day of March 1844 No. 9 Surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner, or vessel has *One Deck* and *Two Masts*, and that her length is *Sixty four feet and one inch* her breadth *Thirteen feet and one inch* her depth *seven feet and seven inches* and that she measures *Eighty* tons *Seventeen* ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has *no* gallons and a *Scroll* head.

And the said *James M. Sundry* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this *twenty first* day of *April* in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty *five*
