An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

is at present Master; and, that he hath sworn . . . . . is a

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cincinnati in 1838 &  
rebuilt at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1845 as appears by Her Enrolment dated at

the Port of Buffalo New York the 30th day of April 1845, which Enrolment is wrongfully withheld from the Owner as appears by the Oath of Stephen Card filed in this Office the 27th day of April 1845

And the said Enrolment . . . . . having certified that

the said Steam Boat or vessel has Five Decks and one Mast and that her length is Two hundred and Eighteen feet and eight inches

her breadth Thirty feet . . . . .  
her depth Fourteen feet . . . . .

and that she measures Eight hundred & Eighty seven tons Fifteen . . . . . ninety-fifths:  
that she is a Steam Boat has no Gallies . . . . .  
and a small . . . . . head.

And the said Trust S. Prosser . . . . . having  
agreed to the description and measurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
