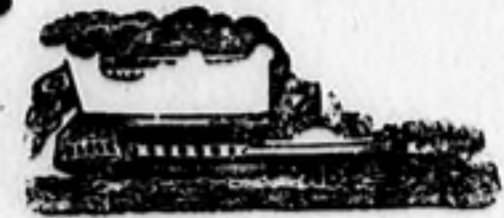

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John P. Phillips of Buffalo Erie County New York
Having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Oregon of Buffalo whereof Henry Randall is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Anupport St Clair County Michigan in the year 1835 as appears by the Oath of Z. Hangebrunn Master Carpenter dated July 29th 1835 and filed in this Office

And A. D. Robbins Deputy Collector having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has Five Decks and that her length is Five hundred & three feet and six inches her breadth Thirty feet her depth Fifteen feet and four inches and that she measures Two hundred & eighty one tons Five ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no galleries and has a figure head

And the said John P. Phillips having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this twentyminth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five
