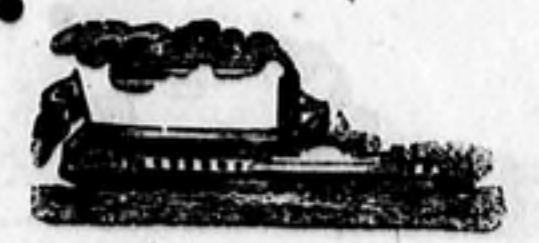

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838. Stephen Clark of Buffalo N. Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with John Liberty of the same place T. Powers Augustus Jones George Dr Jones Benj B. Jones, Barna Moker Calvin Croward & Joel Dr McQueen of Charleston Ohio William Saw of New York City bring

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the *Constitution* of Buffalo whereof William Brown is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Charleston Ohio in the year 1837 as appears by her Enrollment dated at the port of Buffalo the 14th day of August 1844 numbered 50, fifty now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is one hundred and fifty feet and six inches her breadth twenty eight feet and six inches her depth twelve feet and one inch and that she measures Four Hundred Eighty three tons fifty nine-fifths that she is Steam Boat has no galleries and a figure head.

And the said Stephen Clark having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
