

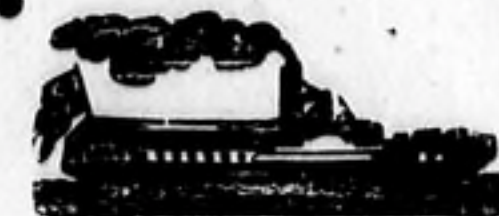

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner _____ or Vessel called the
Free Trader _____ whereof Augustus L. Keeler _____
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn _____ is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cape Vincent
New York _____ in the year 1837 as appears by her Enrollment dated at
Cleveland Ohio April 10. 1844 and numbered fifteen - 15 - now
surrendered having changed owners _____

And the said Enrollment _____ having certified that
the said Schooner or vessel has one Deck _____ and two Masts _____ and that her
length is Seventy seven feet _____
her breadth Nineteen feet and ten inches _____
her depth Eight feet and two inches _____
and that she measures one hundred eleven _____ tons twenty three _____ ninety-fifths
that she is Schooner _____ has a square Stern _____
and a Figure _____ head.

And the said Joseph B Gardner _____ having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner _____ has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
