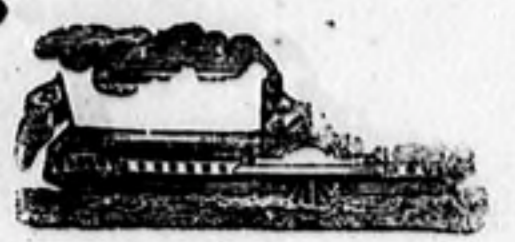

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

length is ninety four feet & three inches _____
her breadth twenty three feet & three inches _____
her depth eight feet & six inches _____
and that she measures one hundred sixty seven tons four _____ ninety fifths:

And the said James Holmes _____ having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner _____ has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
