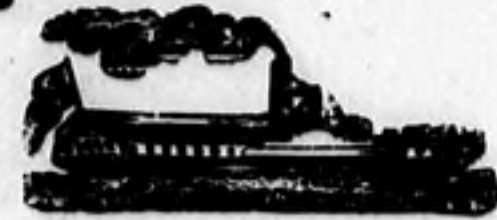




# ENROLLMENT.

ON 31<sup>st</sup> May 1847

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

George B. Walbridge of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Benjamin Knowlidge of the same place are

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Conroy* whereof Benjamin Knowlidge is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Elk Creek Pennsylvania in the year 1811 as appears by her last Enrollment dated at this Port April 18. 1843 ~~disembarked June 19~~ now surrendered having changed owners, ~~June 19~~

And the said last Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts, and that her length is One hundred and two feet her breadth Seventy three feet eight inches her depth nine feet and four inches and that she measures Five hundred and four tons twenty nine-fifths that she is a Schooner has no galleries and no figure head.

And the said George B. Walbridge having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
