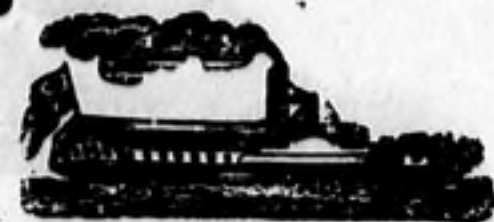

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Morris Hazard of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with George C. White Thomas Adams William Edwards, & Co. of the same place and Charles Swift & N. W. Farnham of Silver Creek N.Y. E. Woodward & C. Blackner Troy N.Y. and Louis A. French of Buffalo N.Y.

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the *Chautauque* whereof *Morris Hazard* is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo 1839 and built in the year 1844 as appears by her Enrollment dated at this Port the 20th day of June 1844 numbered thirty eight (38) now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is One hundred and fifty three feet and six inches her breadth Eighteen feet and two inches and her depth Seven feet and six inches and that she measures Two hundred and four tons forty nine ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has one gallery and a screw head.

And the said Morris Hazard having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this Twenty second day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty six.
