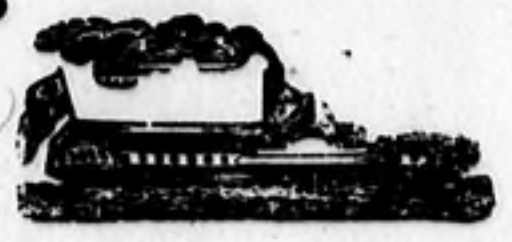

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

David Melleson of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that the Perryburgh Steam Boat Company of which he is Secretary & James Melleson of Perryburgh Ohio is President are

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the *Superior* whereof the said David Melleson is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Perryburgh Ohio in the year 1845 as appears by her last Enrollment dated at the Port of Mammee City Ohio the 10th day of September 1845 numbered on 111 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said last Enrollment having certified that the said Steam Boat or vessel has one deck and one mast and that her length is one hundred and thirty one feet her breadth twenty seven feet and eight inches her depth eleven feet and two inches and that she measures five hundred & eighty seven tons Seventeen ninety-fifths that she is Steam Boat has one mast and head.

And the said David Melleson having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
