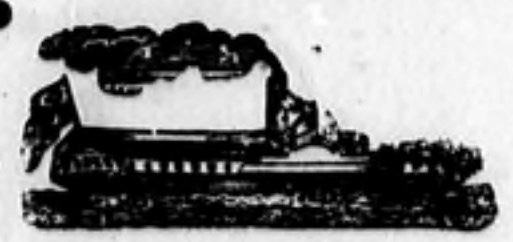

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

James M. Miller of Ithaca N.Y.  
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Canal Boat or Vessel called the  
Princeton of Ithaca — whereof the said James M. Miller  
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn — is a  
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Ithaca N.Y.  
in the year 1846 as appears by the Certificate of the  
said James M. Miller builder dated at this port the 25<sup>th</sup>  
day of May 1846 now on file at this port —

And the said Certificate — having certified that  
the said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and — and that her  
length is seventy eight feet and eight inches —  
her breadth Fourteen feet and six inches —  
her depth Seven feet and eleven inches —  
and that she measures Eighty four — tons thirty two ninety-fifths:  
that she is a Canal Boat has  
and head.

And the said James M. Miller — having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-  
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at  
the Port of Buffalo Creek.

in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty six.
