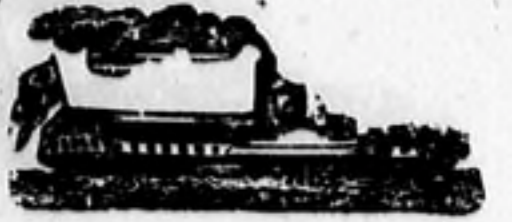

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

William E. Midner of New York City N.Y. is having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Army Hawkey of Little Fort Illinois are

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel called the Waterloo whereof the said William E. Midner is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black Rock N.Y. in 1840 & rebuilt in the year 1844 as appears by her Enrollment dated at this Port May 11. 1844 and numbered Thirty-130 which Enrollment has been lost as appears by the oath of G. Robertson her late master filed in this office June 4th 1846

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or vessel has One deck and no masts, and that her length is One hundred and twenty six feet and two inches her breadth Eighteen feet and four inches her depth Six feet and four inches and that she measures One hundred & forty two tons Seventy two ninety-fifths that she is a Steam Boat has no galleys and a Figure head.

And the said William E. Midner having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
