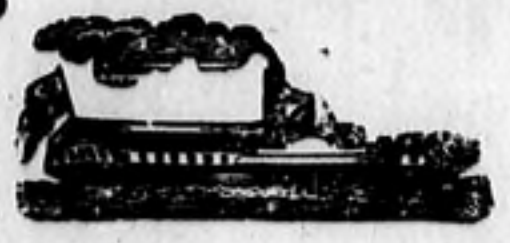

Ohio _____ in the year 1811, as appears by the certificate of
William Great Master Builder, now on file in this
Office _____

And the said certificate _____ having certified that
the said Brig _____ or vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her
length is one hundred and twenty five feet and nine inches
her breadth twenty seven feet and one inch _____
her depth ten feet one and a half inches _____
and that she measures three hundred fifteen tons seven _____ ninety-fifths:
that she is a Brig _____ has _____
_____ and a screw _____ head.

And the said Henry Mc Kinne _____ having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig _____ has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
