An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Elijah Cobb of Albany N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES sole owner of the Brig Ansel K. Cobb or Vessel called the

Ansel K. Cobb whereof Charles Rogers

is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black River Ohio

in the year 1844 as appears by her certificate of enrollment issued at the port of Cleveland Ohio April 23rd 1846 and numbered Seventeen - 17 - now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that

the said Brig or vessel has one Deck and two Masts and that her

length is one hundred and seven feet & three inches -

her breadth twenty three feet and eleven inches

her depth nine feet and eight inches

and that she measures two hundred twenty six tons seven ninety-fifths

that she is a Brig has a Square Stern

and a screw head.

And the said Elijah Cobb having

agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig Ansel K. Cobb has been duly enrolled at

the Port of Buffalo Creek.
