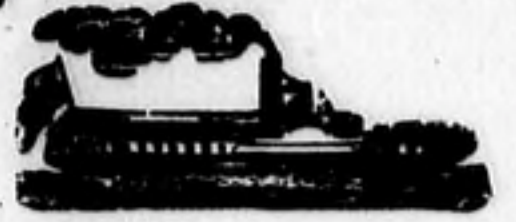

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838. *Amel R. Cobb* of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he registers with *John Palmer* of White Town N.Y. and

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owners of the Schooner *Watts Sherman* or Vessel called the *Watts Sherman* whereof *John M. Kirby* of Cleveland Ohio is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1846 as appears by the Certificate of *Frederick W. Jones* master builder

And the said Certificate having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one Deck and two Masts, and that her length is one hundred and three feet her breadth twenty two feet and ten inches her depth nine feet and three inches and that she measures One hundred and thirty eight tons fifty one ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and has a *Scull* head.

And the said *Amel R. Cobb* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this *sixth* day of *October* in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty *six*
