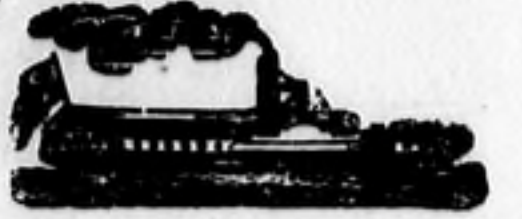

ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John R. Wheeler of Buffalo N.Y.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Simon Miles of the same place and Nathan Dilton of Brandt in County New York are Citizens of the United States + sole owners/subject to a certain mortgage executed by Simon Miles and John R. Wheeler to Jeremiah C. Oliver dated the 2^d day of September 1846 to secure the payment of thirty eight hundred + seventy five dollars being for purchase money

of the Schooner or Vessel called the Marion whereof Nathan Dilton

is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a

Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Black River

Ohio in the year 1841 as appears by her Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo N.Y. the 22^d of November 1841 now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is Eighty two feet and six inches her breadth twenty feet and five inches her depth nine feet and four inches and that she measures One hundred & forty tons eighty six ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has no galleries and a scroll head.

And the said John R. Wheeler having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this fourth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty six
