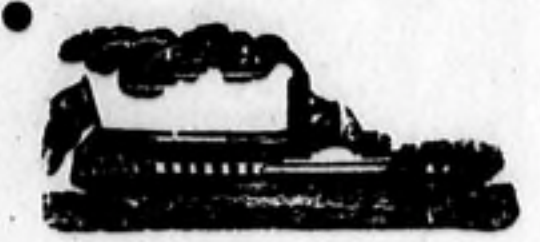

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

William R. L. Ward of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the *Brig* or Vessel called the *Swanwick* whereof *Andrew M. Johnson* is at present Master, and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Wilt Haven New York* in the year 1835 as appears by the Enrollment dated off this Port the *15th* day of *Aug* 1846 and *Numbered (57) New Numbers*, having changed name and the said enrollment, having certified that the said *Brig* or vessel has *One* Mast and *two* Masts, and that her length is *Eighty two* feet and *five* inches, her breadth *Twenty* feet and *two* inches, her depth *Eight* feet and *two* inches, and that she measures *One hundred twenty* tons *Twenty* six *ninety* fifths, that she is a *Brig* has *two* Gallies and a *Bill* head.

And the said *William R. L. Ward* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said *Brig* has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this *21st* day of *April* in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty.
