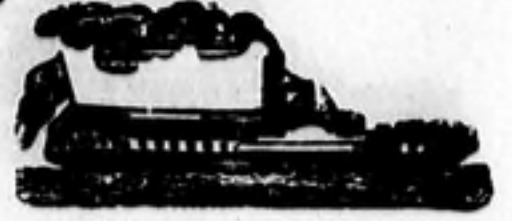


ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

William Vaughn of Oswego NY by his Attorney Channing W. Spauld
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES sole owner of the Brig or Vessel called the Robert Knicker whereof Edward W. Train

is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y.

in the year 1811 as appears by Mr. Ensign's certificate at this Port dated the 14th day of May 1844 and amounting to twenty eight tons and having changed

and this said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or vessel has One No. 10 and Two No. 12 and that her length is Eighty seven feet and six inches

her breadth Twenty three feet and four inches her depth Nine feet

and that she measures One hundred and forty two tons Eighty seven ninety-fifths that she is a Brig has no forecast

and head.

And the said William Vaughn by his Attorney having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
