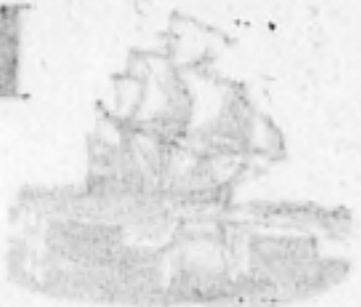

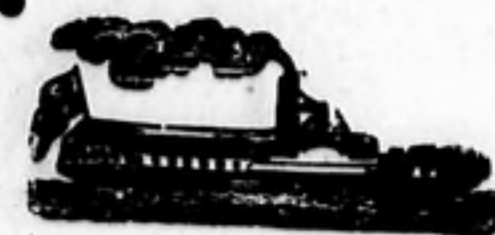

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John Mackintosh of Buffalo Creek County N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Henry J. Warren of the same place, and Elgie Hodges, Charles Hodges, James Whitely and Robert Belden of Mansfield Ohio

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the Mansfield whereof Francis Cullander is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn in is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1847 as appears by the Certificate of Frederick N. Gould Master build up file in this office.

And the said Certificate having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has one deck and two masts, and that her length is one hundred and fifteen feet and five inches her breadth twenty three feet and eight inches her depth eight feet and one half inch and that she measures two hundred and thirteen and twenty seven ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has and is head.

And the said John Mackintosh having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.

Given under my Hand and Seal of Office, at the Port of Buffalo Creek in the said District, this twentieth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty seven
