

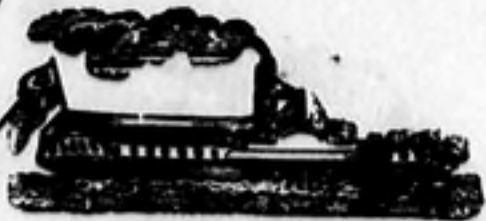

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Joseph Pebody of Buffalo N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Ship or Vessel called the
Constitution whereof Charles J. Magier

is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at French Fork
in 1835 & rebuilt in the year 1845 as appears by New Enrollment dated
at the Port of Buffalo N.Y. the thirty first day of March 1846 and
numbered five (5) New Numbered having changed name

And the said Enrollment having certified that
the said Steamer or vessel has One deck and two masts, and that her
length is Eighty seven feet and three inches
her breadth Nineteen feet and Eight inches
her depth Eight feet and four inches
and that she measures One hundred thirty tons fifteen ninety-fifths
that she is a Steamer has no galley
and a boiler head.

And the said Joseph Pebody having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conform-
ity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamer has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.

in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty seven.
