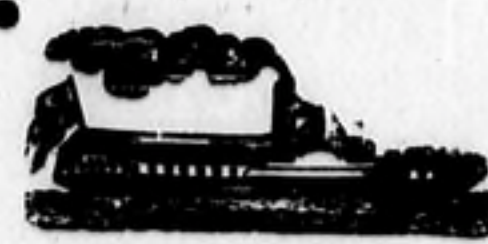

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

And the said Certificate having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One Mast, and two masts, and that her length is One hundred & Eighty feet Ten inches - 118-10 in her breadth Twenty three feet and Nine inches - 23-9. her depth Nine feet and Seven inches - 9-7 and that she measures Two hundred & fifty tons Fifty Nine ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner has a square Stern and screw head.

And the said Wm. W. P. P. having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
