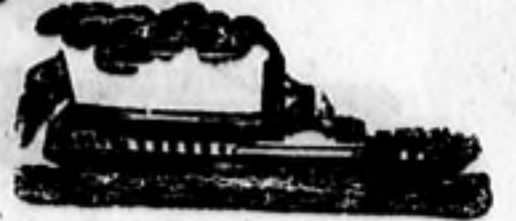


ENROLLMENT.

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

George B. Walbridge of Buffalo N.Y. &c
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with
Messrs A. Walbridge J. W. Blossard and Benjamin K. Walbridge
of the same place are

CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES, sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the
"Henry B. Bishop" whereof Benjamin K. Walbridge
is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn
Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo
N.Y. in the year 1847 as appears by the certificate of the
J. J. Masten builder dated 11th month of April
1847, now on file in this Office
And William J. Leach Surgeon having certified that
the said Schooner or vessel has two masts and one deck and that her
length is One hundred thirty one feet and three inches - 131' 3"
her breadth Twenty four feet two and three fourths inches - 24' 3/4"
her depth six feet and five inches - 6' 5"
and that she measures One hundred thirty three tons eighty nine-fifths
that she is a Schooner has or
and Seal. head.

And the said George B. Walbridge having
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified and sufficient security having been given in confor-
mity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at
the Port of Buffalo Creek.
