

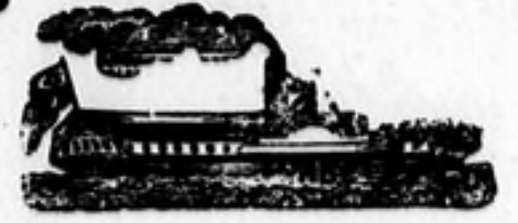

IN CONFORMITY TO

An act of Congress of the United States of America, entitled "an Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c. passed the 18th February, 1793, and "an Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and "an Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board of vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

Henry M. Quinn of Buffalo N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he together with Charles Wagoner of the same place

Windsor sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the Frederick whereof Edwin Owen of Buffalo N.Y. is at present Master; and, as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Irving Chauntangus Co New York in the year 1847 as appears by the Certificate of the Master hundred Charles Stewart. On file in this Office dated the 15 April 1847.

And William G. Mack, Surveyor having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and two masts and that her length is One hundred & fourteen feet seven inches 114 ft 7 in her breadth Twenty five feet and one inch 25 ft 1 in her depth Two feet and three inches 2 ft 3 in and that she measures Three hundred & sixty nine tons thirty five ninety fifths that she is a Schooner has one head and a bow head.

And the said Henry M. Quinn having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo Creek.
