In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the *Laurel Boat* or Vessel, called the *Harvard* whereof *Oliver R. Phil* is at present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Albany N.Y.* in the year *1846* as appears by the Oath of *John Morris* dated the *10th* day of *August* *1846* Don't file in this office

And the *William J. Orwick* Surgeon having certified that the said *Laurel Boat* or Vessel has *one* *hull* and that her length is *seventy eight* feet and *eight* inches her breadth *fourteen* feet and *one* inch her depth *five* feet and *five* inches and that she measures *five* *dis* tons *thirty two* ninety-fifths; that she is a *Laurel Boat* has

And the said *John Morris* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said *Laurel Boat* has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
