In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

Pillsbury is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Astoria Ohio in the year 1844 as appears by her Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo this third day of August 1847, and Number Eighty three (83) now surrendered having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Ship or Vessel has One d. M. and Two Masts and that her length is One hundred and fourteen feet 114 ft her breadth Twenty five feet eight inches 25 " 8. her depth Nine feet eight inches 9 " 8. and that she measures Two hundred fifty six tons forty nine ninety-fifths; that she is a Brig has the gallery and a Scull head

And the said John F. Porter having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Ship has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
