In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John F. Puter of Buffalo, N. York, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Brig or Vessel, called the Claspin whereof Samuel Alexander is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1844 as appears by the Enrollment dated

at this port July 7, 1844 and Number Forty three (43) (New Number)

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has One Mast and Two Masts and that her length is One hundred and Twenty five feet seven inches 125 ft 7, her breadth Twenty six feet and Eleven inches 26 ft 11, her depth Nine feet and seven inches 9 ft 7 and that she measures Two hundred and twenty five tons ninety-fifths; that she is a Brig and a Deck head

And the said John F. Puter having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
