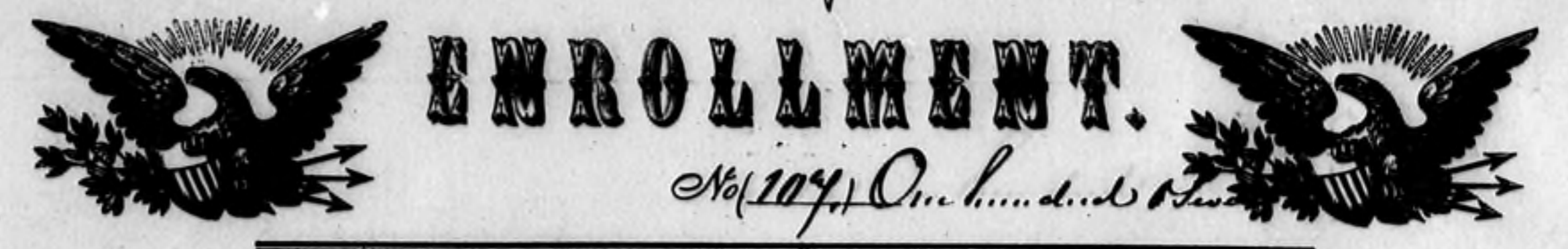

In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John F. Puter of Buffalo New York
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a
Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Brig or Vessel, called the
Europe whereof A. W. Roper is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cinifut Ohio in the year 1844 as appears by the Enrollment dated at the Port of Buffalo New York August 31 1844 Number fifty four (54) Now Surrendered having changed names And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Brig or Vessel has One (1) Mast and that her length is One hundred and two feet and five inches 110 ft her breadth Twenty five feet and five inches 25.5 ft her depth Nine feet two inches and a half 9 3/4 and that she measures Two hundred thirty four tons Eighty four ninety-fifths; that she is a Brig has No. gally and head

And the said John F. Puter having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Brig has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
