In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

George Raymond of Buffalo New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Constitution of Buffalo - whereof Gilbert David is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Frenchtown N.Y. in 1835 in the year 1845 as appears by New Certificate dated at

this first day of April 1847. Number 247. Twenty four New York having changed name and the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two Masts and that her length is Eighty seven feet three inches her breadth Sixteen feet and eight inches her depth Eight feet and four inches and that she measures One hundred thirty five tons ninety-fifths that she is a Schooner and a beam head And the said George Raymond having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
