In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Dolphin whereof William Wate is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Avon Ohio in the year 1836 as appears by his Enrollment dated

at the Port of Cleveland Ohio May 30, 1843 & number 25, twenty five now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is seventy two feet three inches her breadth nineteen feet eleven inches her depth seven feet three inches and that she measures ninety one tons sixty two ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a square stern and a scroll head

And the said William Wate having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
