In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Steamboat or Vessel, called the Argon whereof George L. Chapman is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Warren Michigan in the year 1845 as appears by Mer. Enrollment dated

at this port of Warren the Thirtieth day of August 1846, Numbered 44 Twenty Seven Non Surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Steamboat or Vessel has one deck and one masted and that her length is Two hundred and three feet & six inches 203 ft. 6 inches her breadth Thirty feet 30 " her depth Three feet and four inches 34 " and that she measured Over hundred & eighty one tons fine 181 " and that she is a Steamboat has 11 galleries and a figure head and a figure head

And the said George L. Chapman agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
