at this port April 10th, 1846, Number 40, which enrollment had been lost and applied by the Oath of James Haggart dated April 24, 1848, now in file in this Office, And the said enrollment _____ having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that her length is One hundred and twenty eight and two eighths 176 ft 2 in her breadth Eighteen feet and four inches 18 ft 4 in her depth Six feet and four inches 6 ft 4 in and that she measures One hundred and forty two seventy two ninety-fifths; that she is a Steam Boat and has no gallery _____ and _____ head And the said James Haggart _____ having agreed to the description and measurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
