In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

Having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Minerva

whereof John W. Bull is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio in the year 1835 as appears by the Enrollment dated

at this port May 4. 1847 and Number (39) now numbered

having changed owners And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two Masts; and that her length is Fifty seven feet and ten inches 57 ft 10 in her breadth Eighteen feet and six inches 18 ft 6 in her depth Six feet and eight inches 6 ft 8 in and that she measures Sixty tons Sixty four ninety-fifths;

that she is a Schooner and a Stern head And the said John W. Bull having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
