In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

William O. Brown of Buffalo New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with Nelson Bigelow of Buffalo New York,

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Dan Marble, whereof Nelson Bigelow is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Connequot Ohio in the year 1848 as appears by the certificate of John

W. Tyler Master builder, dated the 23rd day of May 1848, now on file in this Office,

And the William O. Mack Surveyor having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts, and that her length is one hundred, four feet and two inches 11 1/2, feet 2 in her breadth Twenty four feet ten and one half inches 24 " 10 1/2, her depth Nine feet one and three fourths inches 9 " 1 3/4, and that she measured Two hundred thirty six tons sixty eight ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has

and a stern head And the said William O. Brown having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, New York
