In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,  
Orville W. Ranning of Buffalo New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Willow Travels, whereof Richard Puffel is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Silesburg in 1839 and rebuilt at this in the year 1844, as appears by his Enrollment dated

at this port the Eleventh day of October 1844 Number 123, One hundred and twenty three, Now surrendered having changed owner. And the two said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two masts, and that her length is thirty feet and six inches 90 feet 6 in her breadth twenty two feet three inches 22 " 3 " her depth seven feet and ten inches 7 " 10 " and that she measured one hundred and fifty one <sup>ports</sup> tons fifty one and ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner and has a figure head

And the said Orville W. Ranning having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
