"An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels." &c., passed 18th February,
1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern,
Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes,
passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of
passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John Poag of the City of Brooklyn County of Kings New York by
his Attorney Merwin S. Hawley of Buffalo N.Y.
having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the
Alunda whereof John Ironing
is at present Master; and as the said Alunda
is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at St. Joseph
Michigan in the year 1847 as appears by Old Enrollment dated

at the Port of Detroit Mich. May 21st 1847 (Number 12, 5000
Now surrendered having changed District
And the said Enrollment having certified that
the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two Masts, and that
her length is One hundred twenty three feet six inches 123 feet 6 in
her breadth Twenty four feet and seven inches 24. 11 "
her depth Five feet and six inches 9. 6 "
and that she measures Two hundred thirty three tons Seventy five ninety-fifths;
that she is a Schooner has No Galley
and No figure head

agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been
given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly
Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
