In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838;

Morris Hazard of Buffalo New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with William H. Hazard of Brooklyn New York William Moulton of Albany New York Samuel H. Mosier and Pardon C. Sherman of Buffalo New York

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Steam Boat or Vessel, called the Onusio State, whereof Morris Hazard is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at St Clair Michigan in the year 1848 as appears by the Certificate of John Griffin dated the 9th October 1848 (Now on file in this Office)

And the said certificate having certified that the said Steam Boat or Vessel has One Deck and that her length is Two hundred and twenty eight feet & Eleven inches 298 ft 11 in her breadth Thirty seven feet 37 her depth Fourteen feet, and five inches 14 ft 5 in and that she measures Fifty seven hundred & fifty three tons seventy ninety-fifths; that she is a Steam Boat has and a Figure head

And the said Morris Hazard having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, C. N. Y.
