In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,
Ferdinand C. Clark of Buffalo New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the **Man Marble** whereof **Wilson P. Wilson** is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at **Cornwall Ohio** in the year 1848 as appears by **John E. Linnick** dated,

At this port 26th day of November 1848, I numbered 957 Mintsy five New hundred having changed owner
 And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has **One Deck** and **Two Masts** and that her length is **One hundred and four feet and two inches** 104 ft 2 in her breadth **Twenty four feet and two 1/2 inches** 24 ft 10 1/2 in her depth **Nine feet One and three fourths inches** 9 ft 1 3/4 in and that she measures **Two hundred and thirteen tons fifty eight ninety-fifths**; that she is a **Schooner** and **a Stern** head

And the said **Ferdinand C. Clark** having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the **Port of Buffalo.**
