In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c.; passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833.

Richard Porter of Buffalo New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the  
North Carolina whereof the said Richard Porter  
is at present Master; and as he hath sworn  
is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Sheffield  
Ohio in the year 1835 as appears by

Her Enrollment dated at this Port, March 9<sup>th</sup> 1848, Numbered, 4, Four now Summited having changed owners.

And the said Enrollment having certified that  
the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and two Masts and that  
her length is Seventy three feet, and three inches 73 ft 3 in  
her breadth is Twenty five feet and nine inches 25 " 9 "  
her depth Seven feet and two inches 7 " 2 "  
and that she measures Ninety five tons fifteen ninety-fifths;  
that she is a Schooner has no galleys  
and a figure head

And the said Richard Porter having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been  
given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly  
Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
