In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 13th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833.

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the *Calphin* whereof *William Math* is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Arvon Ohio* in the year 1836 as appears by her Enrollment dated

at this port the 3^d day of November 1847 & numbered 1387 one hundred and thirty eight said enrollment having been laid out & filed as appears by the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and ten masts and that her length is twenty two feet and three inches 42 ft 3 in her breadth Nineteen feet & three inches 19 ft 11 in her depth Seven feet & three 7 ft 3 in and that she measures Ninety one tons Dis by two ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has square stern and a screw head

And the said *William Math* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
