In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with Elgie Hodges Charles Hodges James Welden and Robert Redden of Mansfield Ohio are

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Mansfield whereof George Callard is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Buffalo New York in the year 1847 as appears by her enrollment dated

at this Port April 17<sup>th</sup> 1847. numbered 18. now surrendered having changed owners

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts and that her length is one hundred and fifteen feet and five inches her breadth twenty three feet and eight inches her depth Eight feet five and one half inches and that she measures two hundred and thirteen tons twenty seven ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner and a scull head

And the said John Fleeharty agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
