In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled  
"An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February,  
1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern,  
Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes,  
passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of  
passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.  
George W. Walbridge, of Buffalo, New York,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Act, and having sworn that he is  
together with Mills S. Walbridge and John R. Blossom, of Buffalo New  
York, and Richard H. Evans, of Erie, Pennsylvania,

Citizen of the United States, and sole owners of the Steam Boat or Vessel, called the  
*Fashion* whereof Richard H. Evans  
is at present Master; and as he hath sworn  
is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Alpena  
Michigan in the year 1847 as appears by her enrollment dated

at the Port of Alpena Michigan, the thirtieth day of September 1847, Number (37)  
thirty seven, and now surrendered having changed name

And the said enrollment  
the said Steam Boat or Vessel has no Mast and having certified that  
her length is One hundred and sixty feet and that  
her breadth is Twenty five feet 140 feet  
her depth is Eight feet and six inches 25 " 8 " 6 inches  
and that she measures thousand and forty four tons thirty two ninety-fifths;  
that she is a Steam Boat has no Galleries  
and a Sail head

And the said George W. Walbridge having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been  
given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steam Boat has been duly  
Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
