In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

William Buckley of Buffalo New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the *Albion* whereof *George Proctor* is at present Master; and as he hath sworn that he is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at *Silver Brook New York* in the year 1839, as appears by *10th Enrollment* dated

at this Port the Twenty second day of June 1848 and Numbered (56) Fifty Six and numbered having registered owned.

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Mast and Two Masts, and that her length is *Twenty feet and six inches* 90 ft 6 in her breadth *Twenty two feet and three inches* 22 ft 3 in her depth *Seven feet and ten inches* 7 ft 10 in and that she measured *One hundred fifty one tons fifty one* ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner and a Paper head

And the said *William Buckley* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
