Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Steam or Vessel, called the Onion whereof Stephen R. Champlin is at present Master; and as he hath sworn

is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Sandusky Ohio in the year 1837 as appears by the Copy of Enrollment dated at the Port of Detroit Michigan, nineteenth day of June 1846. as appears by Bill of Sale

And the Enrollment of the said Steam or Vessel has two decks and one masts and that her length is sixty four feet & eight inches her breadth seventeen feet & six inches her depth six feet and nine inches and that she measured seventy eight tons sixty nine and a half cwt. ninety-fifths; that she is a Steam Boat and has no galley

And the said Stephen R. Champlin and head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Steamboat has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
