 "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February,
 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern,
 Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes,
 passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of
 passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838,

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

 the said Steam Boat or Vessel has One Deck and One Mast and that
 her length is One hundred and fifty three feet, 11 1/2 feet.
