In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,

Charles W. Fellows, of Barcelona, Chautauque County New York, Managing owner, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with

Nelson E. Smith of the same place.

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the *Scow Boat*, or Vessel, called the *Lion*, whereof Charles W. Fellows

is at present Master; and as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Erie Pa in 1845 or rebuilt at Barcelona, N.Y. in the year 1847 as appears by her Enrollment, dated

at this Port, September 4th 1847, and Numbered Ninety three (93). Now Surrendered, having changed owner.

And the said Enrollment, having certified that the said *Scow Boat*, or Vessel has One Deck, and One Mast, and that her length is Sixty three feet and three inches, 13 ft. 3 in her breadth fifteen feet and nine inches, 14 " 9 in her depth Three feet and eight inches, 3 " 8 in and that she measures Thirty Nine Tons, Ninety Two ninety-fifths; that she is a *Scow* has a Square Stem and Stem head.

And the said head having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said *Scow Boat* has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
