In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838.

John A. Stever, of Barabona, Chautauque County, New York, Manager and owner having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with Lewis C. Stewart, and Henry L. Hewitt, of Chautauque County, New York.

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Erie, of Buffalo whereof John A. Stever, is at present Master; and as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Erie, Penn. in 1833 and rebuilt in the year 1846 as appears by her Enrollment, dated

at this port, 30 August, 1849, and Numbered (80) now on and having changed name

And the said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck and Two masts and that her length is Sixty feet, her breadth Eighteen feet, her depth Six feet and nine inches and that she measures Sixty Two tons Eighty eight ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a Stern and head

And the said John A. Stever, having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
