In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1838;

Audson Harmon, of Buffalo, New York

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with Ezekiel F. Harmon, of Buffalo, New York, and Samuel Weather, of Huron, Ohio, and

Citizen of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Francis, of Buffalo, whereof Audson Harmon, is at present Master; and as he hath sworn is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Huron Ohio in the year 1849, as appears by a certified copy of Enroll-

ment, dated at Sandusky, Ohio, 27 August, 1849. The last Enrollment and License, being in the hands of Samuel Weather, who refuses to deliver said papers up.

And the said Certified Copy of Enrollment, having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has one Deck and two masts, and that her length is Eighty one feet 81 feet, her breadth Twenty feet and six inches 20 " her depth Eight feet 8 " and that she measures Twenty Nine tons Twenty ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and a Scow head

And the said Audson Harmon having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
