at this port, June 19<sup>th</sup> 1849, and Numbered State No 427 <sup>62</sup> Northwestern  
having changed names

And the said Enrollment, having certified that  
the said Schooner or Vessel has one deck and two masts, and that  
her length is Ninety seven feet and eight inches 97 ft. 8 in  
her breadth Twenty three feet and ten inches 23 ft. 10 in  
her depth Nine feet and two inches 9 ft. 2 in  
and that she measures one hundred & ninety one tons Seventy nine ninety-fifths;  
that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern  
and a Screw head

And the said Watson W. Fox having  
agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been  
given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly  
Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
