In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833,
 Watson W. Fox, of Buffalo, Erie County, N.Y. Managing owner, —

having taken or subscribed the Oath required by said Acts, and having sworn that he is together with Elijah H. Bruce, of the same place, and
 Charles J. Hodges, of Geneva, New York, are —

Citizen of the United States, and sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel, called the Hope, of Buffalo — whereof John Klasppe, — is at present Master; and as he hath sworn — is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Ship or Vessel was built at Cleveland Ohio — in the year 1847 as appears by her Enrollment, dated at this Port, 19th June 1849, Number (63) now surrendered, having changed owners —

And the said Enrollment — having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One Deck, and Two masts, and that her length is One hundred and Nineteen feet four and one half inches 119ft 4 1/2 her breadth Twenty three feet, Nine and one fourth inches 23. 9 1/4 her depth Nine feet and Six inches 9. 6 and that she measures Two hundred forty nine tons Eighty three ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner — has a Square Stern, — and a Scull — head

And the said Watson W. Fox — having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly Enrolled at the Port of Buffalo.
