In conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and Vessels," &c., passed 18th February, 1793; and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes, passed March 2d, 1831; and "An Act to provide for the better security of the lives of passengers on board Vessels propelled in whole or in part by Steam," passed 7th July, 1833.

I, Gilbert Canale, being former Owner of the Canal Boat called the A. J. Rich, of Buffalo do swear that the said Canal Boat has been, as I verily believe, enrolled and licensed according to law, by the name of A. J. Rich, Buffalo Creek, and that certificates were granted by the Collector of the District of Buffalo Creek, which certificates have been lost, destroyed, or unintentionally and by mere accident, mislaid; and that the same, if found again, and within my power, shall be delivered up to the Collector of the District in which they were granted.
